


## MEG, JO, BETH, AND AMY: A MODERN GRAPHIC RETELLING OF LITTLE WOMEN

	I've heard so many horrible coming-out stories that I started to grow anxious he was going to disown me. Instead, he kissed my forehead and said, "At some point, you're going to encounter intolerance. When that happens, I want you to hold your head high and be proud of who you are. The world's gotten a lot better, but it still has a ways to go. Until then, know that you are never alone. You have me, and you have your family to back you up." Then he told me how the Black Panther Party were allies with the LGBTQ community in the 1970s. Both groups struggled to be recognized as equal to the rest of the populace. Jean Genet, a famous French gay writer and activist, became friends with David Hilliard, Black Panther chief of staff. There's only one person I need to reach: Aunt Cath. She disappeared after I came out. I asked Mom if Aunt Cath maybe homophobic, and Mom didn't say anything except that she loved me and so did Aunt Cath.
